We have presented 40 or so shows over the past 13 years, and this cast will hold a special place in my heart for their talent and dedication.

No less talented and dedicated is our production staff, which also endured much uncertainty and performed herculean tasks (especially during our abbreviated four-day 'tech' week) to create the "frame" for the world of our production: Many thanks to Sharon, Ken, Scott, Paulette, Erin, Devin, Greg, Jilline, Jozi, Suzy, Makenna, Michele and lots of other folks along the way who have helped out when asked.

Thank you for being here. We hope you enjoy the show.
